

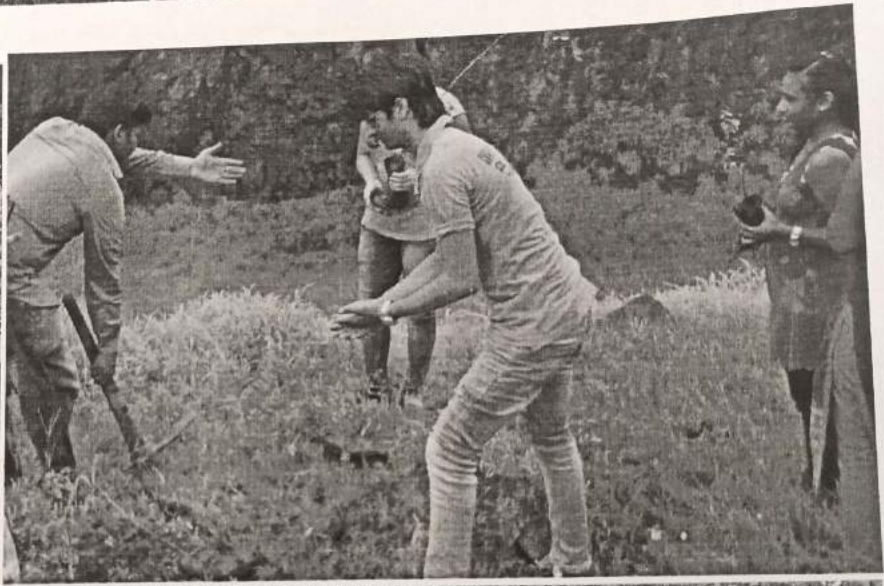

Introduction :

'NAMAMI CHANDRABHAGA' is a water literacy campaign which is organized by Jal Biradari in Maharashtra. Jal Biradari has organized a synergy of 101 River journeys from Kashmir to Kanyakumari.

This campaign covers the route from the origin point of Bhima Rivar (Bhimashankar) to Vijapur

Objectives

The objective of Yatra is to :

To raise the awareness among the youths about their responsibilities towards rivers and free water bodies from constant threats of encroachment, exploitation and pollution,

To establish human river relationship and spread awareness among the locals of villages through 'Nadi sanvaand-Jal Saksharata' campaign.

Members of Jal Biradari under the leadership of Dr. Rajendra Singh ji – Jal purush of India, Ministry of forest and Finance, Govt. of Maharashtra, Under the guidance of Shri. Sudhir Mungantivar ji.

On behalf of Shree Halari Visa Oswal College and under the Leadership of Prin. Dr. Snehal Donde Jalnayak Maharashtra, 17 NSS students of First Year and Second Year of B. Com. and Two faculties have participated in the Jal Yatra to Create awareness through Poster Presentation and Street Play.

Announcement of Water Literacy Campaign

Detailed Report:

Day 1 : Sunday, 6th Aug. 2017.

The journey of Jal yatra was started at 10.30 am and we left the college for Pune. En route Prin. Dr. Donde and Dr. Malti joined us for the journey and enlightened us with the main motive of the Jal Yatra and role of students in spreading awareness of River pollution, encroachment and exploitation.

We reached Pune at 4.15 pm. In the evening, The water Literacy campaign was started at YASHADA, Pune. On this occasion following personalities were present.

On this occasion, Jal Kalash, symbolic representation was poured with the holy water of rivers. It was decided that this Jal Kalash will be taken along with the Yatra and Holy water of Aall tributary rivers of Chandrabhaga will be poured into the kalash.

On that day Centre for Water Literacy was established to form action plan for river rejuvenation and execute plan .

Day 2 7th Aug. 2017

In the morning, All the members of Jal Yatra gathered at YASHADA. Dr. Rajendrasingh ji had oriented all members about the purpose and aim of the Yatra. He handed over Jal Kalash to Prin. Dr. Snehal Donde to convene the Yatra. By his blessings and wishes our Journey started for Bhimashankar where the Bhima river Originates. We reached Bhimashankar at 11.30 am. By looking to problems during the mon the of January to june in bhimashankar, Dr. Rajendra ji explained the importance of water and how people are responsible for creating pollution of on ther river. He urged all villagers to conserve the bhimashankar forests as Bhima river will survive on the survival of forests.

Then all had participated in the Pad Yatra from Forest officer's Build. To the Bhimkund. It was arranged to seek blessings and pujan of Origin of Bhima river. At that point, Dr. Rajendrasingh ji had given pledge to all the villagers for keeping river water clean. He had given a slogan for the Yatra : **'Bhima nadi ko Bachane ki Jang Me, Hum sab Sang me'**. After pujan, The book **'NAMAMI CHANDRABHAGA'** was unveiled and distributed to people.

After the lunch arranged by Villagers, we left for Ghode gav, Manchar. In the evening , small felicitation programme was arranged in the hall of Ghode gaav by the Local Corporations and forest Dept. Manchar. During that programme Group of people created the **BHIMA ACTION GROUP**,



under the guidance the dr. Rajendrasingh ji and Jal Biradari. At the end all had taken pledge on Namani Chandrabhaga to save river. Book on Namami Chandrabhaga were distributed among the people.

An Audio video Van, 'Harit Sena' was given by forest dept. to accompany Jal Yatra at all places.

Night Stay was arranged at Manchar by the forest Dept.

Day 3: 8th Aug. 2017

The day began with the visit of MANCHAR FOREST at 6.30 am under the guidance of Forest officer Mr. Momin. In forest we had seen different types of Ayurvedic trees like aloevera, Nimboo, Ghaypat, Cactus, Bamboo, etc.. We have also observed the dam constructions at different leves of Matha to Paytha. Various dam types like Gabian Structure, Stone Bridge, Cement Bridge, Soil Bridge were constructed to prevent water flow from rivulets and Soil erosion. Students curiously asked many questions regarding Dam structure and learnt how water is preserved in natural way.

At 10.00 am after having breakfast we visited to Annasaheb Awate College, Manchar. Where Street pay was performed by our college students for the first time in front of more than 100 students and college faculties. Appreciation was received by the team from college authorities of that college.

At 11.00 am, an orientation programme was arranged at college for students. The members and volunteers of Yatra had explained the Water pollution problem and solution. Dr. Shailaja from Jeevit Nadi Foundation had given the powerpoint presentation on the History of the river Bhima and Sahayadri Mountain. She also explained the alternative ways of daily lifestyle to save water from pollution. In that programme an initiative was taken for cleaning the river by forming the group of students. Mr. Sunil Joshi had taken the enrolments of students for this campaign. At the end Pledge was taken by all for saving river.

After lunch at 3.00 pm we reached Hutatma Rajguru college of Rajguru nagar, Street play was performed by the students on the 'Jal Bachao' in front of 4000 students of the college. Mr. Narendra Chugh explained the purpose of Jalyatra and contribution to be made by students of college in saving the river. The session ended with Pledge for saving water, At 5.00 pm there was water testing for checking the Dissolved Oxygen (DO) level in river water. A special kit was given by Dr. Vinod Bodhankar (President, Sagar Mitra foundation, NGO) to Hutatma college NSS students. Water testing took 30 min to get the results. The level of DO wasppm. Dr. Vinod also explained how the students of school in pune had joined hands to reduce pollution by separating plastic waste and organic waste from waste bins.

The day ended with reaching Pune at night with lots of knowledge gaining and meeting people.



Day 4; 9th Aug. 2017

After Breakfast, We left for Aalandi. In Alanadi A Rally was arranged from Chatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Statue to the Gyaneshwar Mauli Sanjivan Samadhi Mandir at Indrayani Ghat. In this rally all school and college students of nearby area had participated. The rally began with the Jal kalash puja at statue and kirtan performed by School students. At the end of rally, we visited samadhi Mandir and sought blessings of Saint gyaneshwara. At Inndrayani Ghat, Kalash puja and arti was performed by the Dr. V.D. Karad and other members. Pledge on Namami Chandrabhaga was taken by all.

In noon, small welcome programme was arranged by the Gram panchayat of Alandi. They felicitated all the Jal yatra members and appreciated the efforts for creating awareness on river pollution. Street play was performed by our college students in front of 350 students.

After lunch at jalaram Mandir, alandi, We left for Dehu. In Gatha mandir campus a small talk 'Gram samvad' was arranged. Water activists, panchayat people, faculties of conquest college had participated in it. In that talk, people shared their experience of water crisis faced by them and their solutions. 'Pollution free and Jalparni free water group' was formed.

In the evening, Water testing (DO level) was conducted at indrayani river bank by college students under the guidance of Dr. Vinod Bodhankar. The result was DO Level 8ppm.

All had dinner at pune at night stay was arranged at pune.

Day 5 10th Aug. 2017

The day started with the River cultural walk at the bank of MUtha river which was arranged by the JEEvit nadi Foundation,(NGO). During walk, Dr. Shilaja Deshpandey had explained the brief history of origin of Shayadri Mountain range and mutha river. She had given information about the changing conditions of river over the years. Different species of birds and animals were the habitat of Mutha river bank but due to human civilization and encroachment at river, slowly many species became extinct. At the end of river walk, Jal kalash puja was performed and mutha river water poured in that kalash.

After river walk, Vithyarthi-Nadi Samvad was organized at pune University by the Environmental dept. of the University. During that session, Sandeep Chodankar had shared his experience of Panchganga Rejuvenation. Dr. Shailaja Deshpandey has given ppt presentation on Mutla and Mutha river and its present conditions and solutions. Students were invited to share their experience on water related issues. Many students sought guidance on several issues of water availability, its quality and measures for improvement. Dr. Nitin Karmarkar, V.C. of the University assured that University will contribute to the water conservation and river purification campaign.



After lunch, A closed door meeting was arranged by the Members with the Municipal officers of Pimpri Chinchwad Maha nagar palika. After that At Auto cluster centre, pimpari, a Nadi Samvad was arranged. In that discussion, Mr. Hardikar, commissioner of PCMC had declared that PCMC is all set for the waste water treatment by setting of bio technology enabled plant.

Dr. Sayali Joshi from SERI organization had shared experience of river rejuvenation at Udaypur city and explained that the same plan can be adapted by PCMC.

In the evening Cycle rally was organized from Auto cluster centre to Gosavi Ghat by Members of Cycle Mitra (NGO), Vriksha Mita and Pawna Jalmaistri Abhiyan (NGO). At the bank of Pawna river Street play was performed. Another organization Rally For river, had joined the Jalyatra with the objective to spread information of importance of water. Jal Kalash Pujan and aarti was performed at Gosavi Ghat. Jal Pratigya for Namami Chanmdrabhaga was taken by all.

After that again Cycle rally was organized from Gosavi Ghat to Chikhali Ghat. Jal kalash pujan and aarti was performed. Near the bank of Indrayani river, the local villagers and corporators had joined hands to save indrayani river and formed an action plan for waste water treatment plant set up. The mayor had assured them they they will do the needful at earliest to solve polluted water.

At the end of day, Members of Vriksha Mitra and Cycle Mitra had distributed 2 bags of apple to our college students as a token of appreciation and reward for the efforts. Our dinner and Night stay was arranged at pune.

Day 6 11th Aug. 2017

The morning of that day was blissful as we visited Magar patta city (SEZ), It is First Planned city near Pune. It has set an example for in house in built sewage treatment Plant for solid waste and liquid waste. After visit of campus, Mr. Manek Sharma, Manager of city showed the presentation and explained the formation of city and its planned structure for the convenience of residents and eco friendly atmosphere. Later on Mrs. Sema Bhosle, the plant co ordinator explained the functioning of plants and how solid and liquid waste can be converted into recycled material and income generation. Bio Gas plant is set up for lighting the street lamps at night. The students were amazed by th planned manner of waste disposal practically.

After City visit, The Yatra moved to Ked gaon. In Ked gaon, at 11.30 am there was warm welcome of Campaign people by the faculties of Subhash Baburao Kul College. Street play was performed on front of college students. Young generations of the college were invited to join the Yatra and form Bhima Basin Action Group to discuss and resolve water related issues. Hearts to be connected with the river then only people will understand the problems waste water disposal in rivers. Pledge on Namami Chandrabhaga was taken and books were distributed.



Then at 3.00 pm we reached E.S.Divekar college, Varvand. There was felicitation of all yatra members. Rally was organized by the college students in the college campus. At 4.00 pm we reached Nageshwar Vidhyalaya, Patas, Daund. Our college students had performed street play. The yatra members oriented students about the purpose of This water Literacy campaign and importance of water in our life. They also explained that how we are responsible for the degradation of water quality. the Jal Pratigya on Namami Chandrabhaga was taken by all and at the end rally was organized in the school play ground.

At 5.00 pm, we reached Daund City. The Jal Kalash puja was performed at Ambdkar chowk and rally was started. School students had participated in the rally. It finished at New Municipal corporation build. In the auditorium of build. The welcome programme was conducted by the Corporator Shri Nandu pawar and other members. Shri Sunil Joshi explained the purpose and aim of this yatra and invited audience to come forward for the fight against water pollution. They are invited to form action group to discuss and resolve the issues. At th end snacks were arranged for all. The night stay was arranged in Govt. Guest house.

Day 7 12th Aug. 2017.

In the morning, The yatra started by visiting the college, Kala Maha vidhyalaya, Bhigvan, Indapur. The Jal kalash puja was performed and students were oriented with the importance of water and Bhima river. They had been asked suggestions for the current water crisis by forming Action group and measures for govt. decision. Th pledge on Namami Chandrabhaga was taken and street play was performed.

En route, at the bank of Ujani river, Bhigwan, the talk with fisherman was arranged. The local fishermen explained how the water is affected due to waste water release in river. Skin related diseases are started spreading among those who work continuously in river. They also shared information that there is degradation of quality of fishes and decrease in the species of fishes.

After Lunch, We visited Omkarnath Temple, took blessings of lord Omkareshwar, performed Jal kalash puja at Ranzani gaon, Madha Taluka (Solapur). At 4.00 pm Lok Nadi Samvad was arranged with the villagers of Akole gaon. They had shared their problems of getting fresh and drinkable water. They shared that They have to install water filter or forced to buy bottled drinking water regularly. Th Yatra Members consoled them and asuured them that thwy will give suggestions to govt. for strict policy making. At the end the villages had felicitated the guest with the Shawl and Safa.

In the evening we visited Nira Narsing pur temple for taking the blessings of lord Narsimha. This temple is situated where bhima river and nira river meets. It has its historic importance and connected with mythological story. We all had witnessed the meeting of both the rivers and tested water quality of bhima river.

The day ended with the night stay in govt. guest house at akole.



Day 8 13th Aug. 2017

The day started with the visit of Pandharpur which is situated at the Chandrabhaga River bank. The Bhima river takes the shape of half moon at this point so this river is called as Chandrabhaga. Dr. Rajendra Singh ji had joined the yatra from Pandharpur. He showed the flag to the rally consisting School/college students, members of Warkari Sanghatana, Warkari Sampraday, local people etc, The rally ended at the Chandrabhaga river bank. There they had performed jal kalash puja. After that Jal pratigya was taken on Namami Chandrabhaga at Tikal Smarak.

The Nadi Lok Samvad was arranged at Tukaram Bhavan, Pandharpur. In the presence of 500 people, street play was performed. Dr. Rajendra Singh ji in his speech said that there is need of water rejuvenation in the current times at every phase of river water flow. He urged that Chandrabhaga river can be pollution free and holy if people decides to do so. The programme was ended with the Jal Pratigya on namami Chandrabhaga.

After lunch, The special programme was arranged at Gram panchayat hall to felicitate the efforts of students and faculties to support and participate in the Jal Saksharta Yatra. Dr. Rajendra Singhji had personally appreciated all the students and faculties by giving shawl and shawl. He also said this spirit should be continued afterwards also.

Our college participation in the Jal yatra came to an end by leaving at 5.00 pm from Pandharpur to Mumbai.

We had collected many memorable moments, performed street play, participated in rally and most important explored the problems of villagers in fetching the pure water and their indigenous solutions. We learnt the communication skills with the people, gained confidence in performing on stage and different angles of problem and solutions.

Day 9 14th Aug. 2017

We reached home at 2.00 am.

- 3.) Water from the Pump in the village-11.0 D. O. A

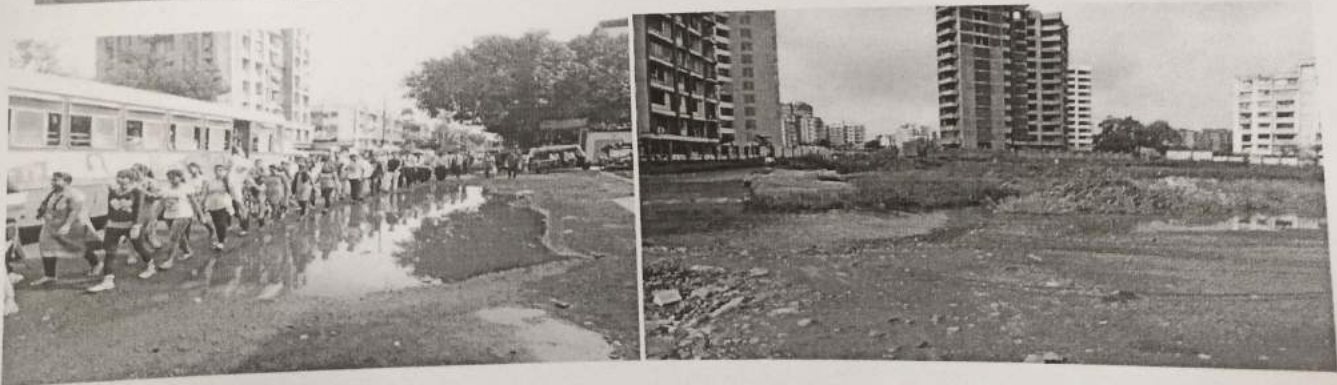
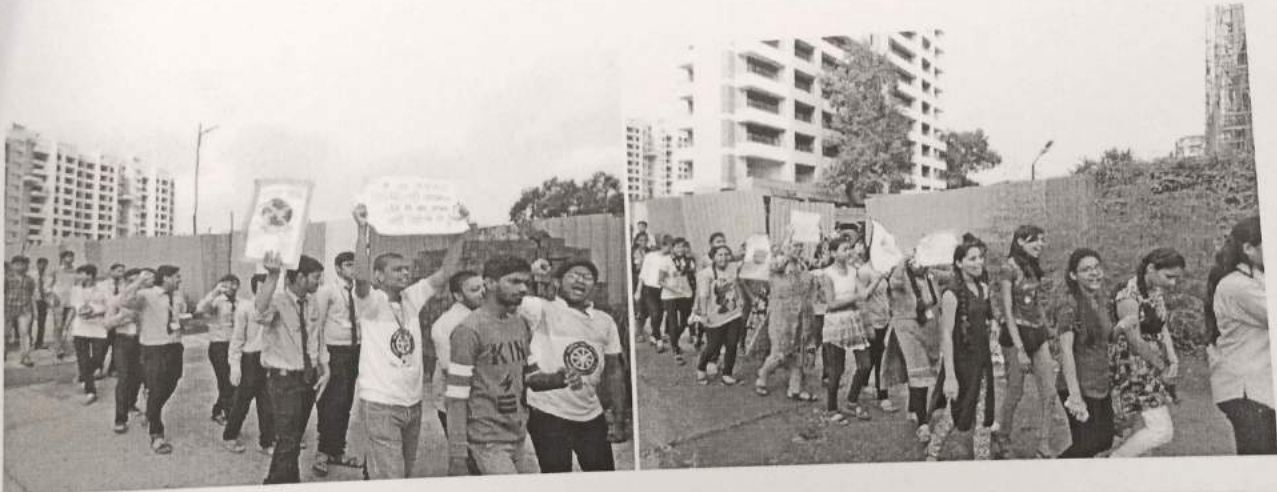

Objective of Activity: To Help and guide the people and police in the 'Ganapati visarjan'.




Outcome:-


- **Execution:-**




Then speaker said decide any two leader two from each group. Then all leaders were called and were asked about their group names and characteristics, then, speaker gave a balloon to each of the group leaders and said to blow the balloon and write the name of the group and first initial of all the group members.




Speaker proceeded with giving another task to write down all the past achievements and goals whichever is it good or bad and also said that each one has to write the upcoming or future goals which they have to achieve within 3 to 5 years. Then she passed a piece of paper in which each of the student had to write the 5 sacrifices which they have to do for achieving their goals and also to write the 3 new things or habits which they want to buildup.

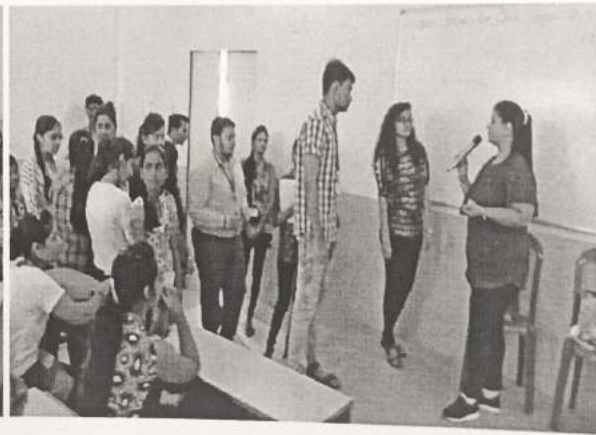
Then speaker gave another task to all the group if they got 86400 to spend then what they will do, with a condition that [they cannot invest in bank or any L.I.C.] and also this spending should be described by all the above 3 characteristics. Few groups performed an act showing distribution of money while few group showed the distribution of money orally in different fields and few group performed an interview showing the social problems and distributed the money accordingly. With continuing activity speaker hid all the balloons in which the group member's first initial and group name was written and selected two random members from each of the group. Then speaker gave the target of 1 minute in which the group members have to search the balloons of their group. The member who completed the target in 1 minute speaker said the person is smart which means and stands for Specific Measurable Action Relevant Time-bond. The purpose was to create or develop sense of alertness and leadership among the girls. Hence the program had ended in success.

- 2.) The interaction with people helped the volunteers to collect data and information for the purpose of statistical analysis.

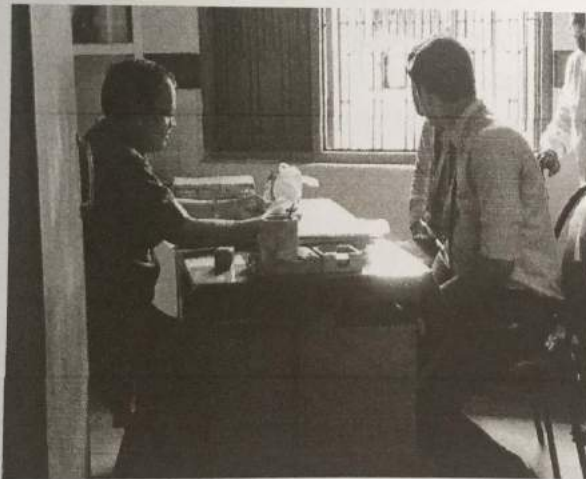
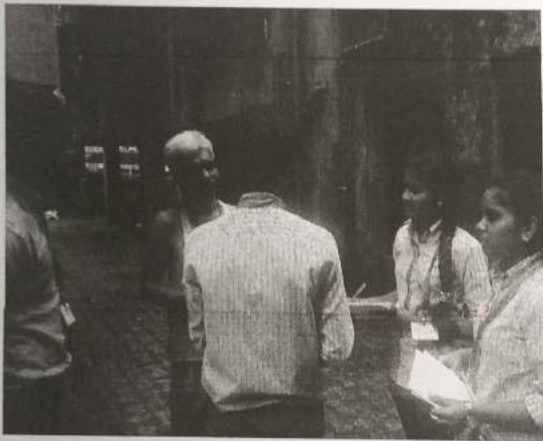
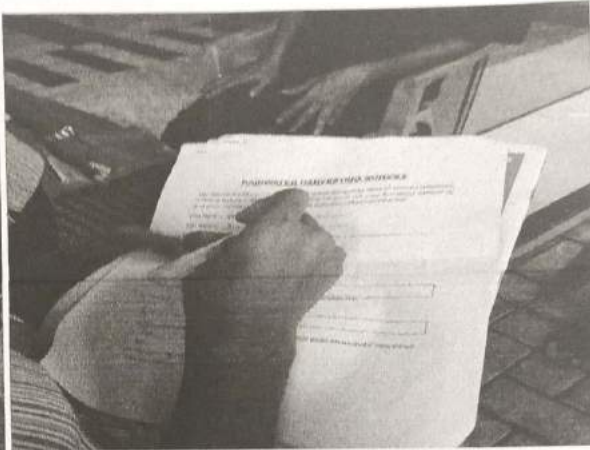

Feedback:

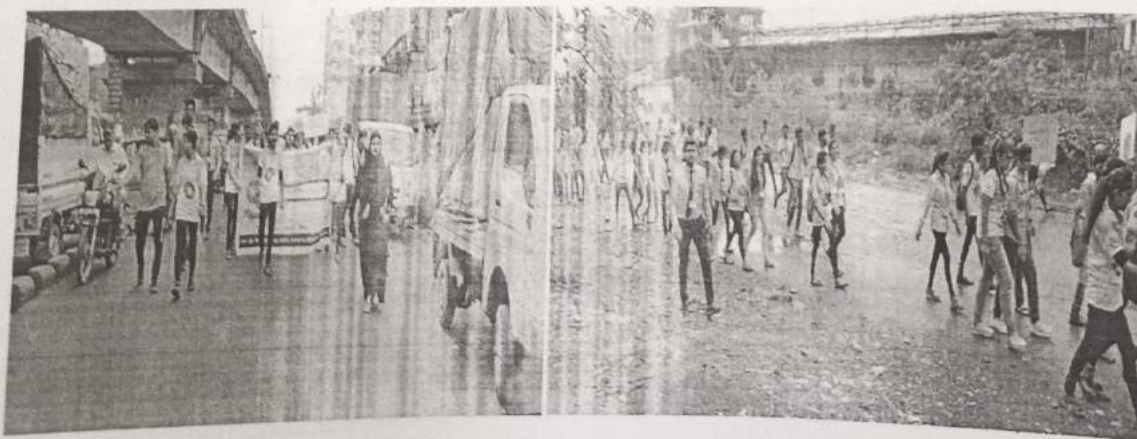

NSS is a voluntary association of youth in colleges, Universities and at 2+ levels working for a campus-community linkage.

The programme aims at developing students' personality through community service. It promotes social welfare among students as well as provides service to society without bias. It also provides help during natural and man-made disasters by providing food, clothing and first-aid to victims. NSS volunteers work to ensure enhancement in the standard of living of people.

NSS Special Residential Camp

NSS Special Residential Camps are camps held annually by the Government of India, and are usually located in a rural village or in a city suburb. Volunteers attending the camp may be involved in activities such as cleanliness drives, afforestation, awareness rallies, street plays and shows spreading awareness, etc. there are no predefined or preassigned tasks; it is left up to the volunteers to provide service in any way that is feasible. Camps typically last between a week and 10 days, although camps for shorter periods are also conducted by NSS.





REPORT

p.m. to 8:00 p.m. After having dinner volunteers shared their experience and wrote the report of the day.



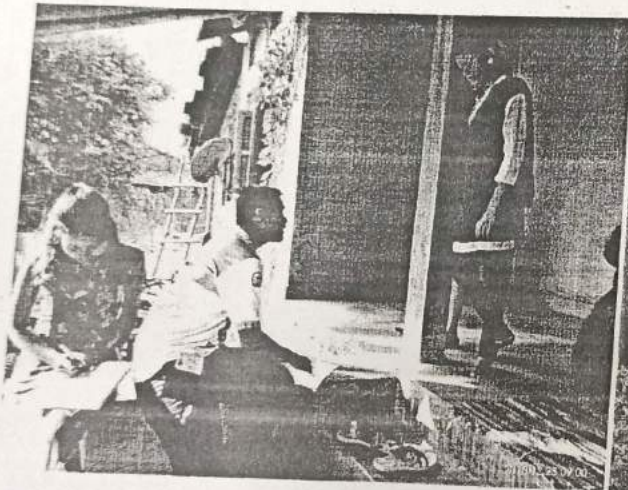
DAY TWO – 25th December, 2018

DAY THREE – 26th December, 2018

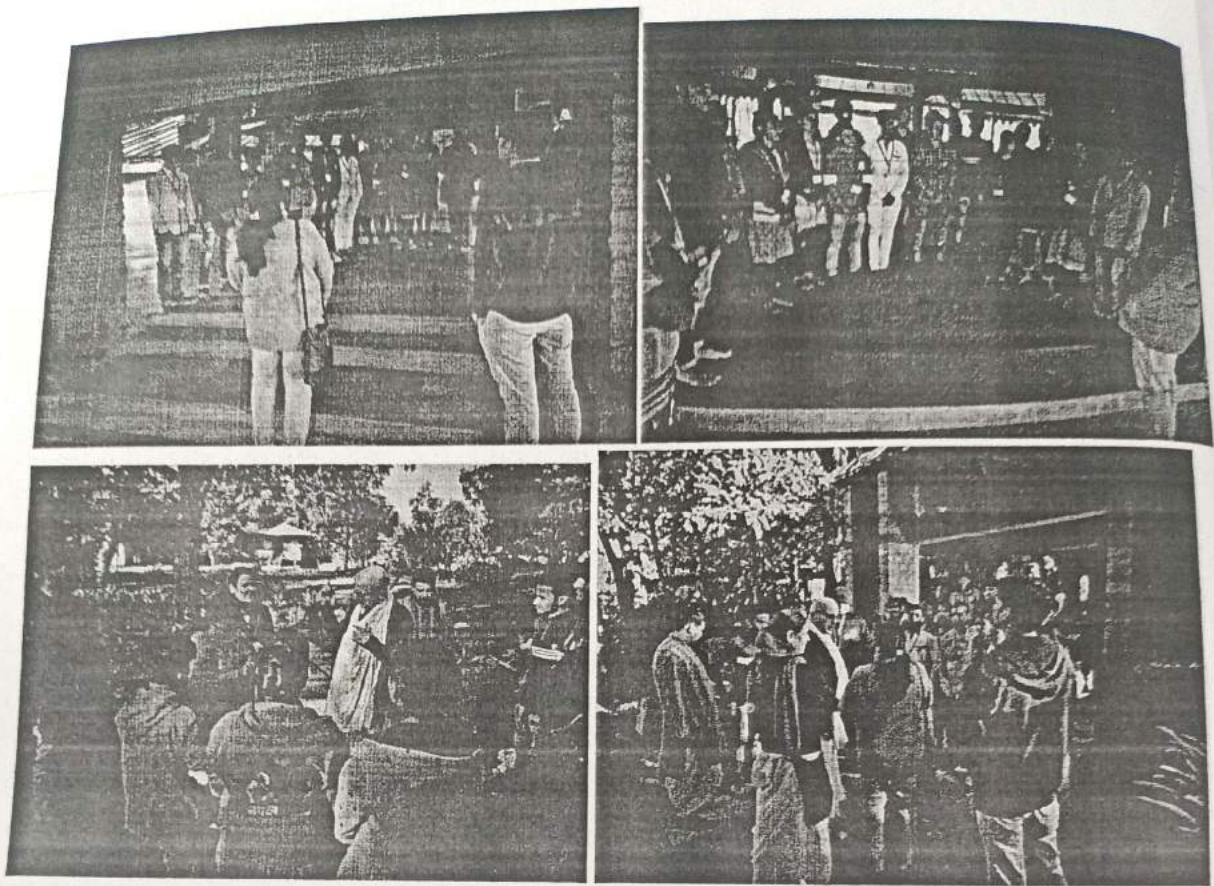

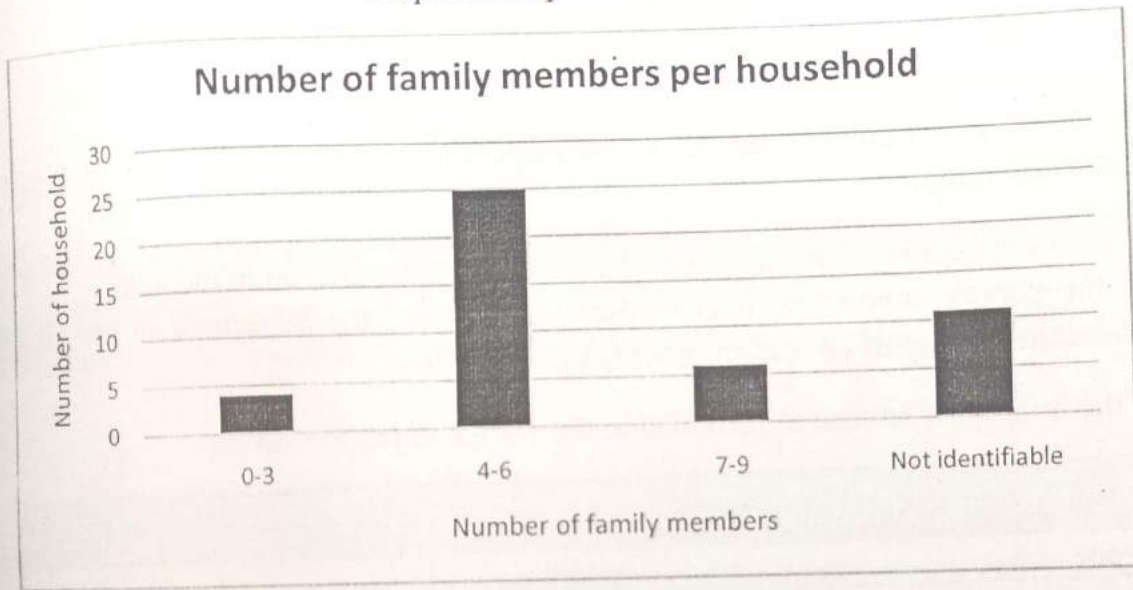

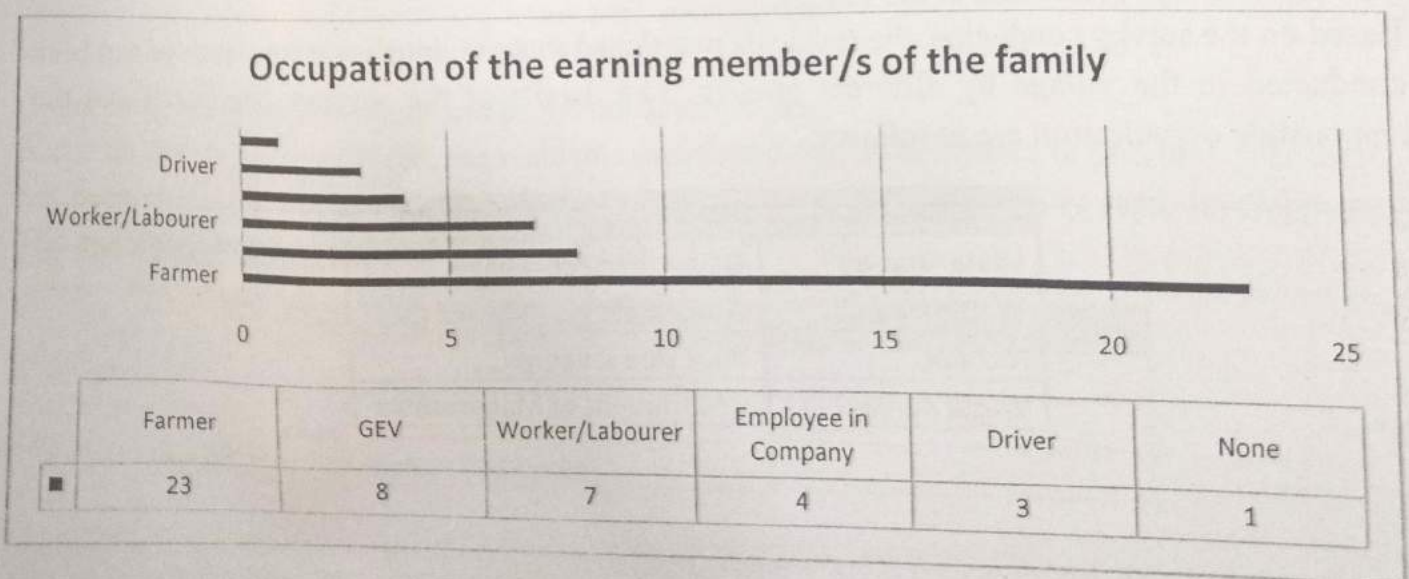
Graphical Representation:

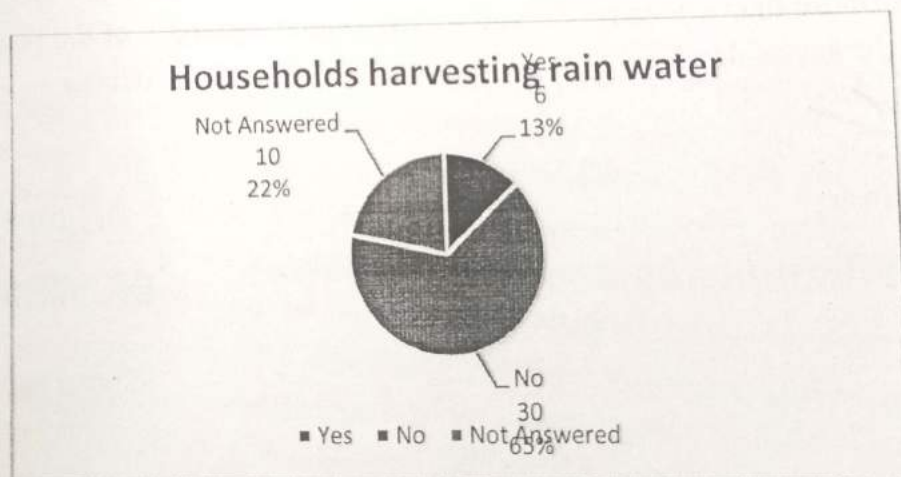




CONCLUSION:

Preparation:

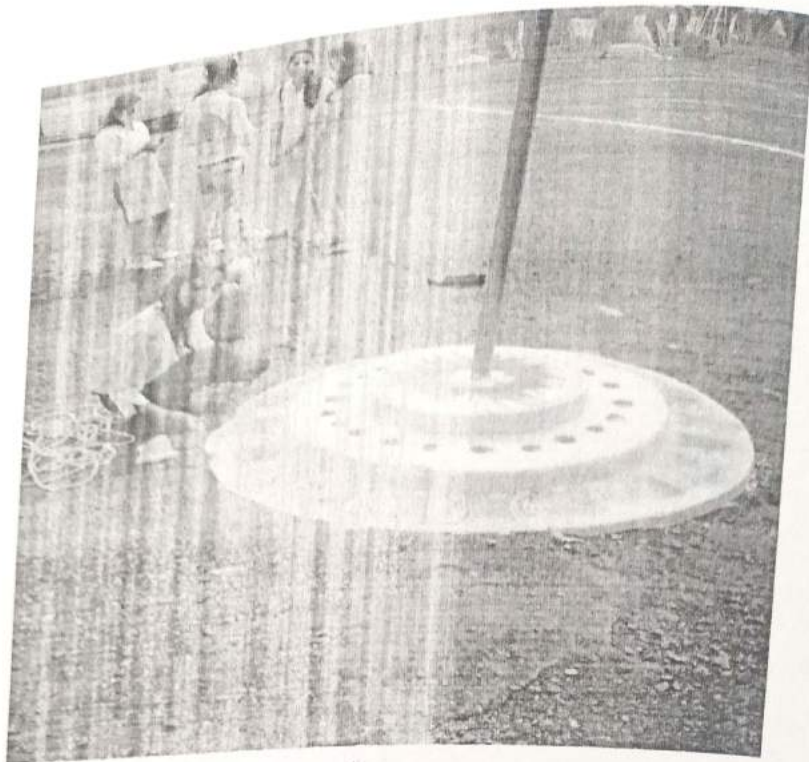

2. 7:30 a.m NSS and F.Y.B.COM students reported the college ground and assisted the college staff in making arrangements for the event.



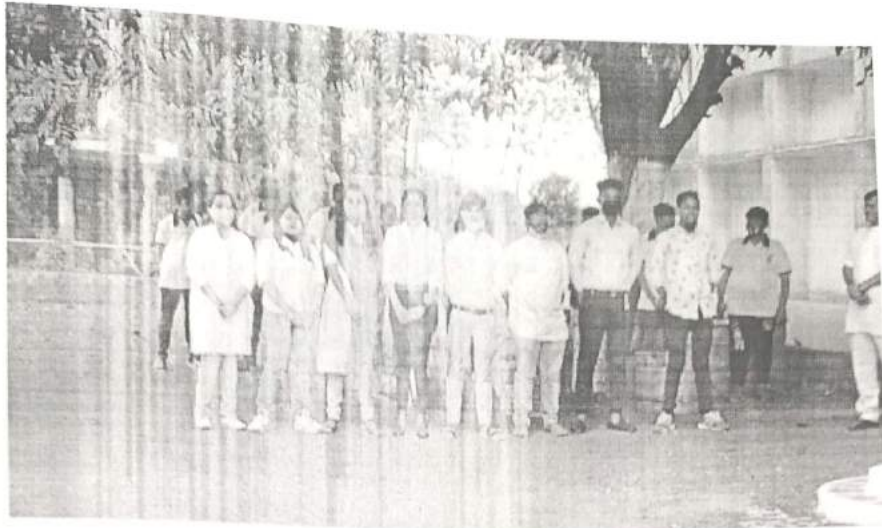

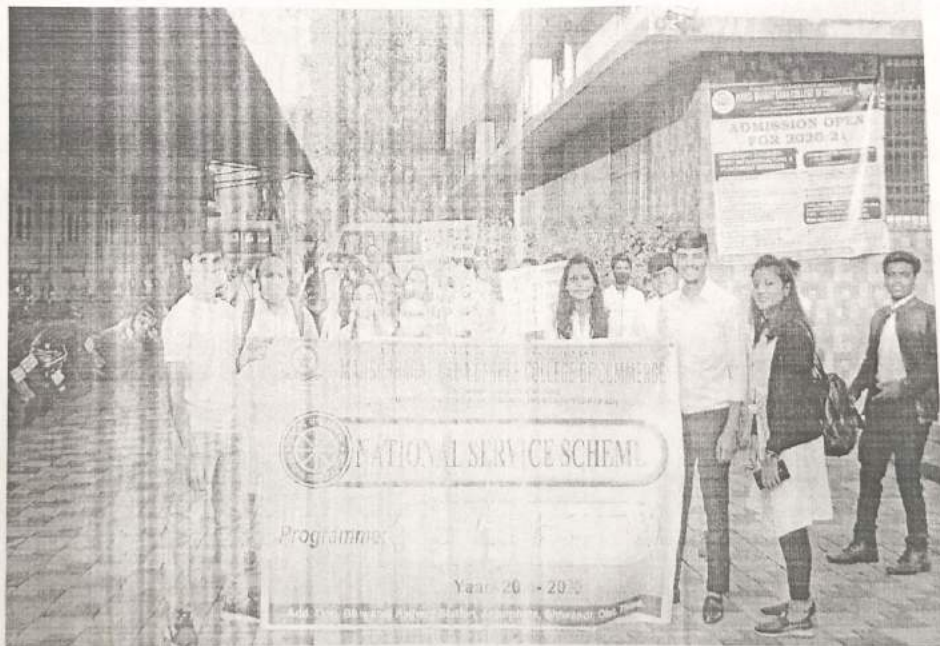


Flag hosting by guest, committee member, college staff and NSS Volunteers

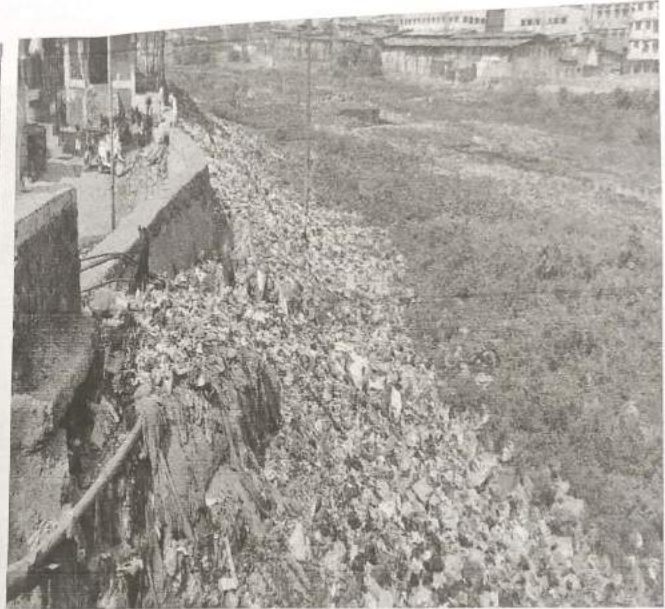

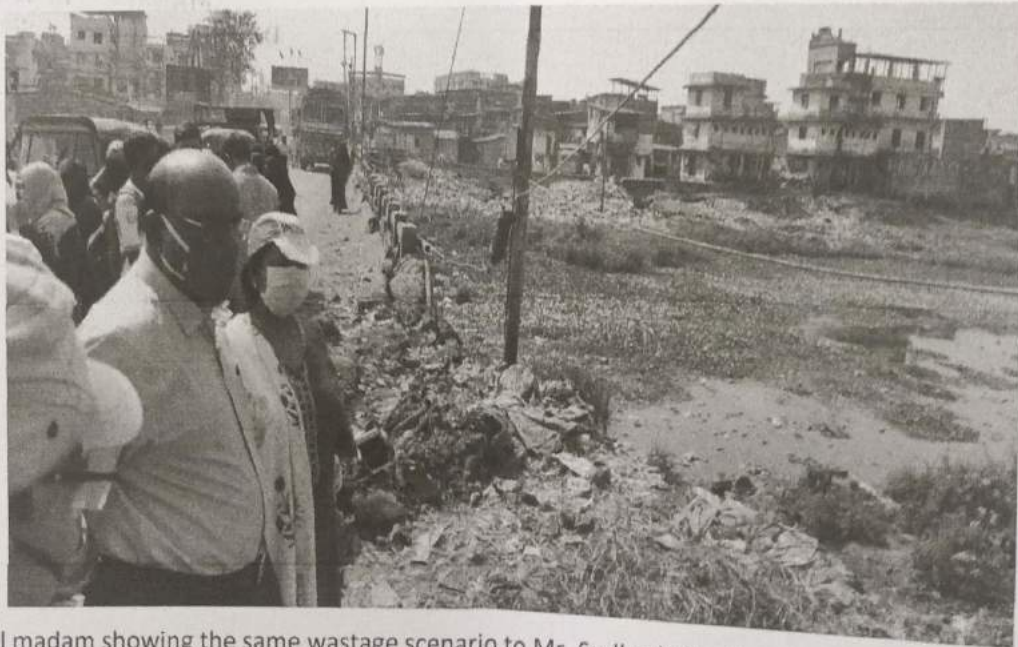

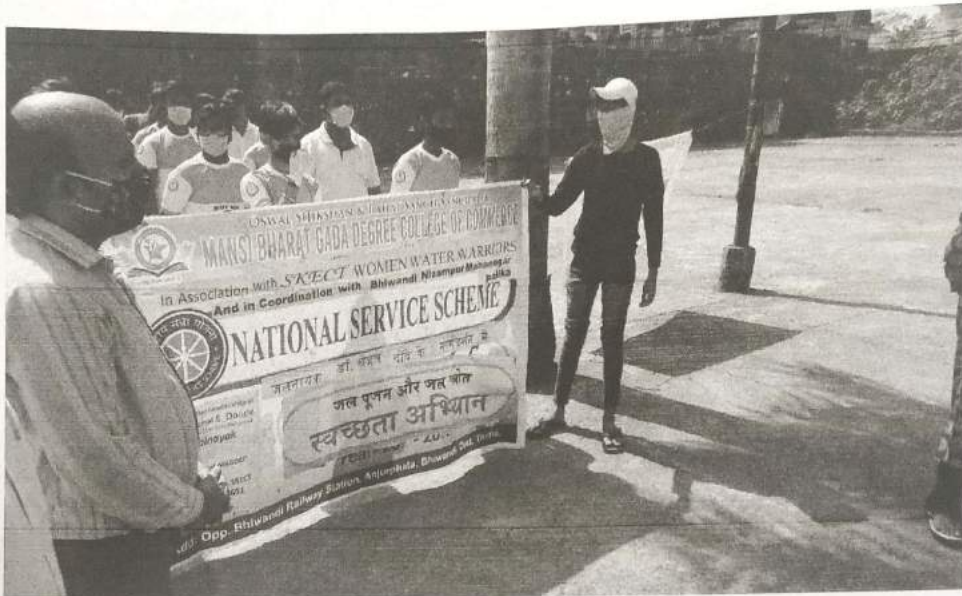

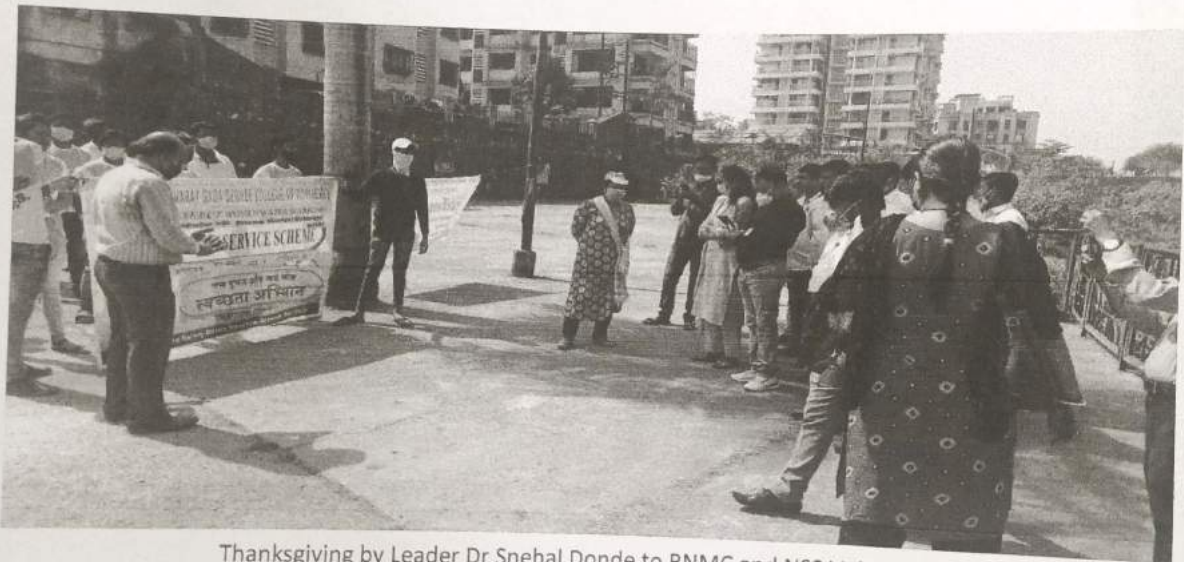

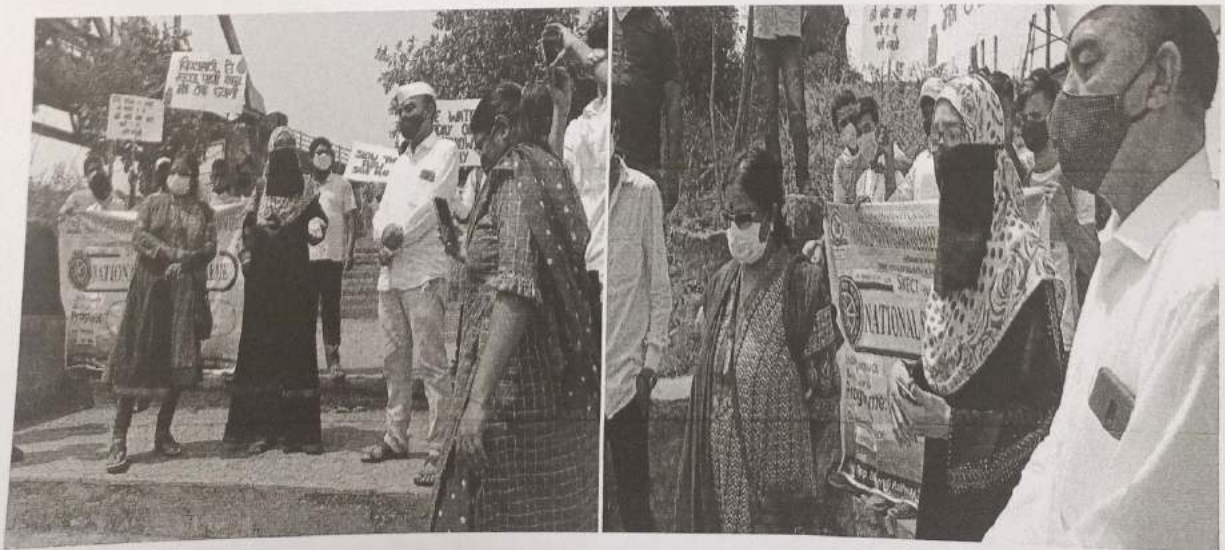
