UG COURSES OFFERED BY THE COLLEGE

Our college offers Undergraduate Programmes in Commerce, Science and Arts, providing students with a wide range of academic and professional pathways under the NEP 2020 framework of University of Mumbai.

Under Commerce, students can pursue B.Com, BAF, BMS, BBI, BFM and at the postgraduate level, M.Com with specialization in Accounting and Management electives.

The Science stream includes B.Sc. and B.Sc. IT programmes.

The Arts stream offers the B.A. programme.

All programmes follow a four-year (eight semesters) credit-based structure, with each semester carrying 22 credits and a total of around 176 credits for graduation.

The FIRST YEAR (Semesters I–II):

Students complete approximately **44** credits, focusing on foundational courses, skill enhancement and value-based learning.

At this stage, students have the option to exit with a 1-Year Certificate.

The SECOND YEAR (Semesters III–IV):

Students complete approximately **88** cumulative credits, with the introduction of intermediate subjects, practical exposure and internships.

Students exiting after this stage are awarded a 2-Year Diploma.

The THIRD YEAR (Semesters V–VI):

Students complete approximately **132** cumulative credits, including advanced core courses and electives, leading to the award of a Bachelor's Degree (Graduate).

The FOURTH YEAR (Semesters VII–VIII):

Students complete approximately **176** cumulative credits, with an emphasis on specialization, research projects and advanced learning, culminating in an Honours or Honours with Research degree.

Curriculum Structure (NEP 2020): The curriculum framework under NEP 2020 is designed to provide holistic, multidisciplinary and flexible education, allowing students to develop academic knowledge, practical skills and ethical values.

- **Major:** Core subject for in-depth knowledge and specialization.
- **Minor:** Secondary subject supporting interdisciplinary learning.
- **OE (Open Electives):** Courses from other disciplines to broaden knowledge.

Skill & Vocational Courses:

- **VSC** (Vocational Skill Course): Practical, job-oriented training.
- **SEC / VSEC** (Skill Enhancement Course / Vocational Skill Enhancement Course): Courses to improve technical and soft skills.

Ability & Value-Based Courses:

- **VEC** (Value Education Course): Focuses on ethics and values.
- **IKS** (Indian Knowledge System): Covers Indian heritage and traditional knowledge.

Experiential Learning:

- **OJT** (On-the-Job Training): Real-world work experience.
- **FP** (Field Project): Field-based practical projects.
- **CEP** (Community Engagement Program): Social learning and community service.
- **CC** (Co-Curricular): Workshops, seminars and related activities.
- **RP** (Research Project): In-depth research on a specific topic.

Eligibility & Admission Criteria:

Candidates must have passed Class 12 (HSC) or an equivalent examination from a recognized board with a minimum of 45% aggregate marks.

For candidates belonging to reserved categories, a minimum of 40% aggregate marks is required, as per government norms.

Admissions are granted based on merit, subject to availability of seats and fulfillment of eligibility criteria prescribed by the institution and university.

The B.Com programme provides a strong academic foundation in key areas such as commerce, accounting, economics and business studies. It is designed to equip students with analytical and problem-solving skills essential for careers in business and finance.

ADMISSION PROCEDURES

First Year (FY) admissions at Mumbai University (MU) for the academic year 2026–27 are conducted through a centralized online process that typically begins in May 2026.

Step-by-Step Admission Process

- **Online Pre-Admission Registration:**
 - Visit the official Mumbai University Admission Portal (or Digital University Portal) to register.
 - Create an account using a valid email ID and mobile number.
 - Fill in your personal details, academic history, and upload the required documents.
- **Fill the Pre-Enrollment Form:**
 - Select your desired courses and affiliated colleges.
 - You must generate a unique Pre-Enrollment Number for each college and course combination you apply to.
- **Individual College Application:**
 - Candidates must fill out a separate admission form for each college they wish to apply to.
- **Merit List Declaration:**
 - Colleges will release multiple merit lists (usually three) based on Class 12 percentages or entrance scores.
- **Document Verification & Fee Payment:**
 - If your name appears on a merit list, you must complete document verification (online or offline) and pay the admission fees within the specified deadline to secure your seat.

ATKT Rules for admission to SY/TY

CARRYFORWARD OF MARKS IN CASE OF A LEARNER WHO FAILS IN THE INTERNAL ASSESSMENT AND/OR SEMESTER-END ASSESSMENT IN ONE OR MORE SUBJECTS: R-1

1. A learner who PASSES in the Internal Examination but FAILS in the Semester End Examination of the course shall reappear for the Semester End Examination of that course. However, his/her marks on the Internal Examinations shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled to the grade obtained by him/her on passing.
2. A learner who PASSES in the Semester End Examination but FAILS in the Internal Assessment of the course shall reappear for the Internal Examination of that course. However, his/her marks of the Semester End Examination shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled for the grade obtained by him/her on passing.

RULES FOR PROGRESSION (ALLOWED TO KEEP TERMS – ATKT): R-2 (For UG programmes:)

1. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester II irrespective of the number of courses of failure in Semester I.
2. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester III if he/she earns 32 or more Cumulative credits from Semester I & Semester II.
3. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester IV irrespective of the number of courses of failure in Semester III.
4. A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-V if he/she earns 76 or more Cumulative credits from Semester-I, II, III & IV.
5. A learner shall be allowed to keep the term for Semester VI irrespective of the number of courses of failure in Semester V.
6. The result of Semester VI shall be withheld by the College till the learner passes all the Semesters from Semester I to Semester V.
7. A Learner is allowed to take admission in semester VII (UG Hon. /PG Part I) only if he passed all courses of semesters I to VI (132 Credits).

Refund of Fees Policy

In case of withdrawal of admission, the refund of fees will be processed as per the following conditions:

- 90% of the fees shall be refunded if the cancellation request is submitted within 15 days before the commencement of the academic session.
- 80% of the fees shall be refunded if the cancellation request is submitted within 15 days after and up to 30 days from the commencement of the academic session.
- 50% of the fees shall be refunded if the cancellation request is submitted after 30 days but within 60 days from the commencement of the academic session.
- No refund of fees (0%) shall be made for cancellation requests submitted after 31st October of the academic year.

Miscellaneous Charges

The charges for issuing various documents are as follows:

- The fee for obtaining a Duplicate Result is ₹100.
- The fee for a Bonafide Certificate is ₹100.
- The fee for issuing a Transfer Certificate is ₹100.
- The fee for a Transcript Certificate depends upon the requirement and is charged either ₹1000 or ₹500.
- The fee for a Conversion Certificate is ₹500.

Scholarships

1. **Oswal Community Scholarship:** This scholarship is exclusively available for students belonging to the Oswal community. Eligible students are granted 75% concession on tuition fees, subject to fulfilling the required criteria.
2. **Scholarship for Needy and Financially Backward Students:** A limited number of five scholarships are awarded to deserving students who demonstrate strong academic performance.

Eligibility Criteria:

- Annual family income should not exceed ₹1,00,000
- Age should be below 25 years
- Must have a consistent and good academic record

3. **ANGC Scholarship:** This scholarship is designed to support economically disadvantaged and deserving students, with preference given to female candidates.
4. **MhaDBT Portal Scholarship (Rajarshi Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj Shikshan Shulkh Shishyavrutti Scheme):** This government scholarship aims to provide financial assistance to eligible students.

Eligibility Criteria:

- Applicant must be a domicile of Maharashtra (including students from Maharashtra-Karnataka border areas)
- Annual family income should be up to ₹8,00,000
- Only the first two children in a family are eligible, as per Government Resolution
- Students admitted under the general category are eligible to apply

- Minimum attendance as prescribed by the university must be strictly maintained.

3. Identity Card

- Wearing the college identity card inside the premises is compulsory.
- Students must present their ID card whenever requested by college authorities.

4. Use of Mobile Phones & Gadgets

- Use of mobile phones and electronic gadgets is strictly prohibited during lecture hours.
- Any misuse will result in confiscation and disciplinary action.

5. Dress Code

- Students must wear decent, appropriate, and college-approved attire.
- Any attire that is inappropriate or offensive is strictly prohibited.

6. Academic Responsibility

- Students must come well-prepared for lectures, presentations (PPTs) and assignments.
- Timely submission of assignments and active participation in academic activities is expected.

7. Conduct During Lecture Hours

- Students must not loiter in corridors or campus during lecture hours.
- Silence and discipline must be maintained near classrooms.

8. Anti-Ragging Policy

- Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited.
- Students involved in ragging will face severe punishment as per government and university rules.

9. Campus Cleanliness & Property

- Students must maintain cleanliness and avoid littering.
- Any damage to college property will result in penalty and disciplinary action.

10. Respect & Inclusivity

- Students must promote a culture of respect, equality and inclusiveness.
- Any form of harassment, bullying or discrimination is strictly prohibited.

11. Disciplinary Action

- Violation of any rules mentioned above may lead to:
 - Warning or fine
 - Suspension or expulsion
 - Other actions as deemed fit by the college authorities
